DVRP Legislative updates

- Removal of the Hero the proposed capital budget request will provide approximately \$3 million for the
 removal of a large vessel in Pacific County that has been deteriorating for 4 years in an important shellfish
 growing area because of a lack of funding to conduct the removal. Received the funds and removed
 the vessel in 2022!
- Pilot vessel recycling program in Port Townsend this request will provide \$100K for a pilot vessel recycling program in Port Townsend, resulting in new opportunities to recycle vessel materials instead of paying for costly disposal in landfills.
 - 10 7 vessels so far Completed! We removed over 11 tons of vessels with 100% recycled!

HB 1700 watercraft excise tax

- Passed and became law in June of 2022
- The legislature approved the program for a transfer from the watercraft excise tax starting the second half of 2021-2023 biennium!



DVRP program deliverables 21-23 and 23-25 biennium's: as of November 18, 2023

21-23 budget was ~\$10M: \$2.5M normal, \$3M Hero, \$4.6M WET Number of vessels DVRP paid to remove: **319** (prior best 123) The *Hero* was removed, and the river was dredged - \$3M 23-25 budget is \$10.3M plus \$1.3M from Northwest Straights Commission

The DVRP currently has ~118 more underway

NWSC vessels: completed 10 and working on the next 10

Vessel Turn-in Program has removed or is working to remove 34

Increased staff to 5 soon to be 6

Large vessel – *Pacific Producer*, Tacoma, Thea Foss Waterway, 170' Sinking on a superfund cap, messy property and lease issues, owner walked away with 7 liens on the vessel worth ~\$1M estimated deconstruction cost \$10M +-30%

Spent or allocated \$4M so far



Current number on the Vessels of Concern list: 287





Rash of Large vessels

JF18-006 *Cairdeas* with Washington Registration # WN 9282 JE. Currently illegally on the Boy Scout Camp Parsons dock.

SN23-030: "USCG 83527": This vessel was being used as a towing resource for Bernhard's growing fleet. Unfortunately, this vessel ended up sinking in Port Townend Bay near Irondale beach Sep 2023.

JF23-007: Western Challenger is a 1942, 130ft minesweeper turned fish processor that was towed in by his retired USCG 83527 in July 2023 and moored it to the unauthorized buoy that the Cairdeas was moored to.

JF23-011: Wooden Tug, possible name Patricia. This vessel is near Irondale and according to an Ecology report

Rash of Large vessels - continued

CZ22-001: Notes from Ecology - On June 28, 2022 a 110 foot wooden WW2 sub-chaser vessel sunk in the Columbia River near Willow Groove, Longview.

PI23-016: The U.S. Coast Guard had removed fuel, oil, and hazardous materials (hazmat) from the 170ft fishing vessel 'Pacific Producer,'

KI14-004 Crest 100+ft
KI16-006 Vigorous 95ft
KI23-027 Coast Angel 100+ft
KI10-005 Onondega 140ft
